**Rank Promotion Testing** – If you are planning to test for rank advancement at the Shufu Judo Yudanshakai Promotional testing event in College Park on Saturday November 8th, all registration paperwork was due by October 25. You can still pay an additional \$10 late registration but all forms MUST be turned in by Nov 1. You can **NOT** register after November 1. You can **NOT** register on site.

**Fall Shufu Yudanshakai Junior and Senior Promotional Examination and Shiai** This year College Park Judo Club, located at the College Park Community Center, 5051 Pierce Avenue, College Park, Maryland 20740, will host the Fall Shufu Yudanshakai Junior and Senior Promotional Examination and Shiai. Both the Junior and Senior Promotions will be held on Saturday, November 8th. Check in will be from 8:30 to 9:00 am. All Judo players with a USJF, USJI or USJA membership are eligible. You MUST be recommended for promotion by your Sensei. **There will be NO on site registration.** Make sure you get all of your paperwork (entry forms, Waiver, Photo copy of USJF, USJI, USJA card or Application, Competition and Service Record, and Check or money order for entry fee) to your instructors.



**ATTENTION:** There will be a Shufu Judo Yudanshakai Board of Directors meeting on Saturday, November 8, 2014 beginning at 8:00 am. This meeting is for current members of Shufu Yudanshakai who hold the rank of Shodan (1st Degree Black Belt) or higher. Additional agenda items must be forwarded at least one month prior

to the meeting date to Mr Charles Medani, Shufu Yudanshakai President. Your attendance at this meeting is indeed appreciated. Please make an effort to be on time.

**Rank Promotions in club(change of belt color)** – If you have finished beginners class you are eligible for promotion to your advanced Rokkyu (White/Yellow belt) or if you test well and exceed all of the requirements you may be able to promote to your gokyu (yellow belt). First you must pay your class dues at the desk at the center (\$30 per session of 2 months). Second, you must join USJF (fill out the form and return it to a sensei with \$50. It is valid for one year). Third, fill out the request for in club promotion form and return it with the promotional fee of \$30. Fourth, see one of the sensei, state that you are ready to test and be evaluated. You will be given a written test and a skills demonstration test. You must complete all of the above before being tested.

**Sensei Diane at World Kata Championships** – Our very own Sensei Diane traveled with Sensei Karl Tamai to compete in the World Kata Championships at the Malga Spain. This event was sponsored by the International Judo Federation. The United States sent seven teams to represent us. The competition had five different kata to could be competed in. It was a rare and unique opportunity for Shufu Yudanshakai, and US Judo, as well as for our competitors. It was an incredible learning experience. Sensei Diane and Sensei Karl competed in the Nage No kata. The Nage no Kata was developed in 1884 and 1885 at the Kodokan. This kata consists of 5 sets of three throws, each performed on both the left and right sides. The two participants formally bow onto the mat and begin the kata with the tori, or thrower, on your right and the uke, or person being thrown, on your left. In each case, the uke attempts an attack on tori. There is a progression of attack styles here, demonstrating how tori must adjust to these differing attacks. Uke then changes his attacks based on the previous adjustments made by tori. Sensei Diane said the main things she learned was to focus on the awareness of your body and motion. Focus on the basic and practice, practice, practice. To be proficient at the kata you must continually practice and perfect it, then continue to practice it daily and learn more each time.

**Shufu Judo Yudanshakai Takemori Open Judo Championships** Hui-O-Judo award winners - James Campbell and Crist Campbell – 1<sup>st</sup> place in Nage No Kata, Elani Green 1<sup>st</sup> place, Steen Green 3<sup>rd</sup> place, Matthew Campbell 3<sup>rd</sup> place, James Campbell 1<sup>st</sup> place.

The event was held on Saturday October 25, 2014 at the DeMatha Catholic High School. This tournament is named after the Takemori Family. The Takemori family has been a large part of Shufu



Yudanshakai since it was founded in 1953. Senseis Jimmy and Edwin Takemori were both incredible competitive judoka in their early days and have been instrumental in the growth of judo in the US. As their competitive time came to end, they grew into international referees and have continued to lead their clubs and Shufu Judo Yudanshakai for over 60 years now. Jimmy, 85 and a ninth degree black belt, first began practicing judo in 1937 in Fresno, California, and has been an instructor in the D.C. area for over 60

years. He has coached both the men's and women's U.S. national teams. The next generation of Takemoris were all skilled judoka on the junior and senior level. Senseis Miki and Terri continue the tradition of developing Junior and Senior elite judokas. We thank all the Takemori family members for their outstanding devotion and service to judo.

Representing Hui-O-Judo Beltsville, brother and sister, James and Crista Campbell teamed up to take the gold medal in the novice Nage No Kata division. In the junior shiai, Elani Green brought home a gold medal after winning her matches against Amya Wallace from Alleghany Youth Development in Pittsburgh PA and Stephanie Cooper, also from Alleghany Youth Development. Steven Green home a bronze medal. He lost to Brent Lorin from Seigneury Judo in Baltimore and Abdai Haji form Alleghany Youth Development in Pittsburgh PA. Matthew Campbell brought home a bronze medal. He lost his first match to Gustavo Arellano from DC Recreation and his second match to Samuel Azzeretti.. James Campbell competed in two divisions. He lost matches to Brent Lorin from Seigneury and Terrell Boddy from Alleghany Youth Development and Kosei Cuyler form Sport Judo. . He placed fourth overall in 13-14 year old middle weight division. In the second division, the 15-16 year old middle weight, he won the gold medal. Defeating two others he had previously lost to. Way to come back James. Crista Campbell competed in two womens senior divisions. In the novice 154 lb division, she placed second after losing to Kimberly Kiersarsky from College Park, she came back to beat Maggie Wong, a Yonkyu from Villanova. In the womens Advanced 154 lbs division she lost all three of her matches and did not place..

The Outstanding Junior Competitor was Bella Bourke from Maryland Judo Team and the Outstanding Junior Team was Sport Judo. The Outstanding Senior Competitor was Alfred Brown from USA Stars East and the Outstanding Senior Team was USA Stars East in Virginia Beach VA.

In addition to the shiai competition, junior and senior judoka competed in the kata divisions. In the Novice Nage No Kata, Crista and James Campbell from Hui-O Judo Beltsville got the gold medal. There was also competition in Advanced Nage No Kata, Advanced Ju No Kata, Advanced Katame No Kata and Kime No Kata. Diane Jackson, Shufu's kata development chair person, has been working to continually expand the development and growth of kata within Shufu Yudanshakai.

It takes lots of staff to make any event happen. We want to say special thank you to all of the volunteers who make our events possible. All of officials who volunteer their time to help make our event successful by being a referee, technical official, or other tournament official. We would like to thank all

## YOSHISADA YONEZUKA



Farewell to a great Judo man and friend. Coach Yonezuka, or Yone to his friends was the kind of man who could inspire a person to want to improve him or herself just by looking at him. There was something about the way Yone carried himself that told you this was a man of great discipline, focus and power. Yone influenced American Judo in such a remarkable way that his legend will truly live on forever. In a coaching career spanning over 50 years, Yone was instrumental in helping great athletes such as Mike Swain, Allen Coage, Clyde Worthen and his son Nick, just to name a few.

Yone's perspective on the sport of Judo was a unique one. He often instructed right handed players to fight left handed. He once explained to me that only the best judoka could achieve this. From the looks of the results, he was certainly on to something. Farewell Yone. You will be missed, but your spirit lives on in those who had the great fortune to be blessed by your presence.

Yoshisada Yonezuka Founded Cranford Judo and Karate Center, Olympic coach Yoshisada Yonezuka, 77, of Cranford, N.J., passed away Saturday, Oct. 18, 2014, at Hackensack University Medical Center. Born in Japan, Mr. Yonezuka lived in the United States since 1960. A prominent member of the martial arts community, he founded the Cranford Judo and Karate Center 50 years ago. In 1988, and again in 1992, Mr. Yonezuka was the head coach of the U.S. Olympic Judo Team. He was a graduate of Nihon University, and had been an officer in many Judo organizations. Surviving are a son, Nicolas Yonezuka (Denise); a daughter, Natacha Yonezuka-Gullo (Geoffrey); four beloved grandchildren, Sophia, Nicolas, Jack, and Kenji; two sisters, Teruko and Nabuko; two brothers, Yoshi and Masato; and his former wife, Anastasia Yonezuka. **Team USA Judo at Grand Slam in Abu Dhabi** - As the IJF's world judo tour continues, this past weekend was time for a very strong Team USA to compete in Abu Dhabi among some of the world's top judokas. The team was comprised of six of USA Judo's best including former Olympians and World Champions. Competition started on Friday, October 31 through Sunday, November 2 with 317 judokas from 58 countries. The first three places in the grand slam went to Germany with seven medals ( 3 gold, 2 silver and 2 bronze), Netherlands and Romania tied with 4 medals ( gold, 2 silver and 1 bronze) and Russia with 5 medals (1 gold, 1 silver and 3 bronze). Team USA placed fifth in two occasions and once in seventh place.



**Male:** DELPOPOLO, Nicholas (-73 kg) – 5<sup>th</sup> Place. Delpopolo won his first two rounds against Greece and Armenia, but lost his third encounter against Russia's Musa Mogushkov. He then defeated Germany's Voelk Christopher in repechage and in his fight for the bronze, he lost to Rok Draksic of Slovenia.

**Female:** HARRISON, Kayla (-78 kg) – 5<sup>th</sup> Place. The Olympic champ won the preliminary round with an ippon against Madeleine Malonga of France, but lost in the second round. Once in repechage she defeated Italy's Assunta Galeone by ippon and in the final match for the third place, Harrison was defeated by Sol Kyong from the Democratic Republic of Korea.

MALLOY, Marti (-57 kg) – 7<sup>th</sup> Place. Marti won the first round against Great Britain. She was then defeated in the second round by Sun Hyo RI Sun of Korea and in repechage by Canada's Catherine Bauchemin-Pinard.

This Grand Slam represented the 5<sup>th</sup> one of the year 2014 and the first one ever in the United Arab Emirates. Abu Dhabi was the preceding host to the season-ending Tokyo Grand Slam taking place in December.

**Athlete Funding for Shufu Yudanshakai Competitors** Shufu Yudanshakai has established the Athlete



Funding Committee to provide funding support for Shufu Judoka who have been representing Shufu at National and International Judo events. To qualify Judoka must have competed in a National Junior or National Senior level and at an E level or better event: the Junior Olympics, International Youth Open, or other Elite events including unfunded international events. Qualifying athletes must be a member of Shufu for at least two (2) years at the time of the application (current year plus previous year) and be a member of an active

Shufu club that has been registered with Shufu Yudanshakai for at least two (2) years at the time of the application (current year plus previous year). Athletes applying for funding through the Shufu Athlete Funding Committee may not be sponsored or financially supported, directly or indirectly, by any other judo organizations. **Fitness Assessments:** Sensei Mark is a certified personal fitness trainer. He offers comprehensive fitness assessments as a free service to any adult judoka who is a student of Hui-O-Judo, and is serious about developing their physical fitness. A fitness assessment uses empirical methods to measure your anthropomorphic characteristics & body composition, flexibility, muscular strength, muscular endurance, and cardio aerobic capacities. After an initial assessment to set a baseline, periodic follow-up assessments can graphically identify changes in your fitness levels, which help to identify strengths & weaknesses of your diet & exercise programs. Each assessment takes about an hour to perform. He performs them in the privacy of his home in Bowie, & results are confidential by law so nobody sees the results but you. If you are serious about your physical fitness levels, see Sensei Mark to schedule an appointment for an assessment.

**Judo Clinics -** Throughout the year, Hui-O hosts clinics for Shufu Yudanshakai. I encourage all of you to try to attend them. The clinics cover a variety of topics. Topics vary from coaching, refereeing, standing techniques, mat techniques, advanced competition skills, different katas, tournament operations, and a variety of other topics. The clinics are held in Beltsville at the Academic Center. They are open to all judoka, regardless of skill level or rank. The clinics are an excellent way to get instruction from different instructors, see new techniques, work with judoka from other clubs, and gain valuable experience and knowledge. Shufu has some of the oldest and best referees, who are all former great competitors, now they are our sensei's and coaches. They live judo in every sense of the word.

**For our Sunday only event judoka** – There are a few tournaments coming up on Sundays. Fliers are available at the dojo or online. If you would like to participate in any of these events, please see one of the Sensei. We are happy to travel to the events with you.

**Club membership** - It is up to each one of you to PLEASE pay your bi-monthly class fees at the front desk. We have kept the rates for the judo club very low since we started the club. However, many judoka on the mat are NOT paying the center for the class. MNCPPC has remarked about this on numerous occasions. If you are not paying your membership with MNCPPC, you will be asked to leave the facility.



**Hui-O travel team** – We are looking at taking small teams of judoka to local tournament a few hours drive from here. Hui-O supports many of the local tournaments to help build fellowship in judo and to challenge us with different types of competition. There are tournaments in Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Virginia, New York, and the Carolinas. However, Sensei Mark and Sensei Kevin both work all day at the events as well as drive and help to manage the team. We would like to have a few parents or senior students volunteer to go along on the trip to help drive and to assist with team management. You can help keep stats on the tournament and take photos at the events for us. Robert Kirk was a huge help to us for our trip up to Connecticut. Having additional people along allows us to take the newer judoka to help them gain experience at small events or allow us to take more seasoned players to high level competitions. Two larger tournaments we attend that are coming up soon are the Liberty Bell in Pennsylvania in April and the AM CAN in Niagra Falls, NY in May.
